

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARATION OF ABSTRACTS

### 1. Introduction

These instructions are intended to help and guide contributing authors when preparing the abstracts that will be used for review. Accepted abstracts will be published in the electronic Book of Abstracts of Coastal Dynamics 2021 as submitted. You are kindly asked to submit your abstract in PDF format. While details of individual contributions may differ from the general scheme found here, we kindly ask you to read these instructions carefully before proceeding to type your manuscript and to use this as a template when preparing your abstract. You can only be the first author of one abstract, but can be a co-author on multiple abstracts.

### 2. Format Instructions

The abstract **must not** exceed 2 pages, including figures and tables. Page size is set to Letter 21.6 x 28 cm (8.5 x 11 in) with 2.54 cm (1 in) for top and bottom margins and with 2.54 cm (1 in) for left and right margins. Use 12 pt. Times New Roman font throughout, including figure captions. Metric units of measure should be used in all instances (colloquial units allowed in parentheses, as above).

On the first page, the title of the paper is to be typed in bold, upper-case letters. Authors' names, affiliations, and email addresses are placed with one blank line under the paper title. Primary and secondary topic areas are to be included in the header. Primary authors who are full-time students may enter in the student paper contest, and should identify interest in the header.

### 3. Headings

Headings are to be typed in bold, upper- and lower-case letters, with one line space above the heading.

### 4. Tables, Figures, Equations and References

Figures and Tables should be placed immediately following their citation in the text, or, on the next full page if space is limited. Skip one line above and below tables. If the table heading extends over one line, continue on the second and following lines immediately below the first letter of the heading. Do not use full stops at the end of the heading. Use horizontal lines above tables, below column headings, and below tables. Use capitals for the first letter of column headings. As far as practicable, arrange the tables in the vertical direction just as in the text. Table 1 is an example of a suggested table format.




Figure 1. Shoreline change behind emergent detached breakwater (Color figures are allowed)

Skip one line above and below figures. Color figures are accepted. Place figure captions at the bottom of the figures and leave one line of spacing between figures and captions. Do not use

full stops at the end of figure captions. Start the second and subsequent lines immediately below the first letter of the caption. Skip one line after each caption. Legends, scales, etc. must be large enough to be legible. Give the consecutive numbers for tables and figures, respectively. Figure 1 is an example of an acceptable figure.

Equations should be numbered sequentially and with a format as follows.

$$\frac{X}{L} \leq 48(1 - K_t) \frac{H_0}{D} \quad (1)$$

where  $X$  = structure length;  $L$  = wave length;  $K_t$  = transmissivity;  $H_0$  = deep water wave height; and  $D$  = water depth.

For references, in the text, the author's last name should be followed by the year of publication, e.g. "it has been demonstrated (Hanson and Kraus 1990) that ..." or "Herbich (1999) showed that ...." In the list of references, arrange authors' last names in alphabetical order with indentation for the second and following lines of each reference. When two or more references by the same author(s) are listed, the earlier work should appear first.
